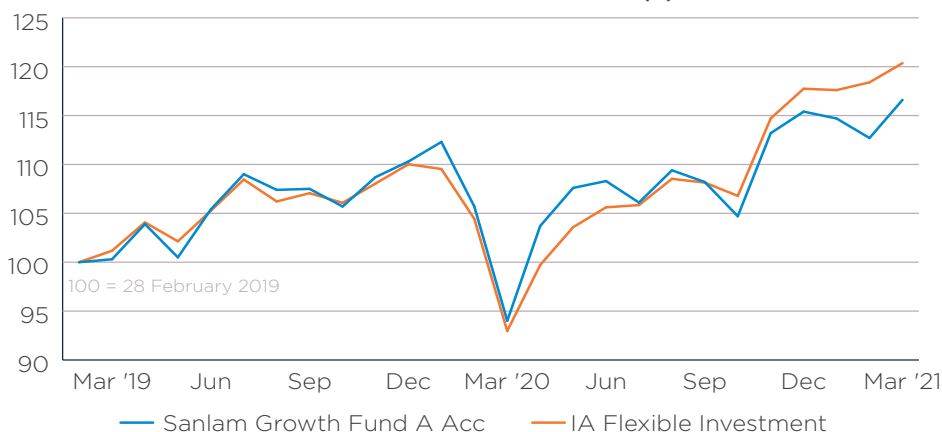

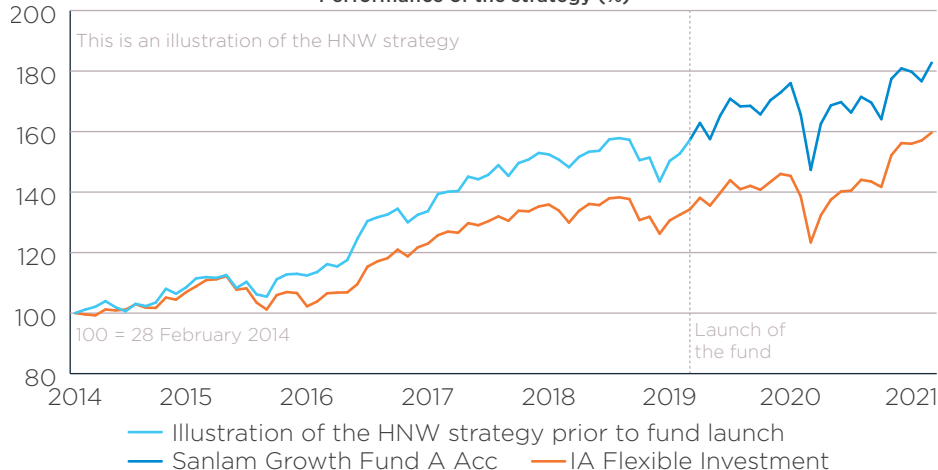

Phil joined Sanlam in 2014, and is the Chief Investment Officer for Sanlam Private Wealth UK. He graduated with a first-class honours degree in Mathematics from Oxford University and began his career in 2000 with the European Equity team at Tokyo Mitsubishi Asset Management. In 2006 he joined the Global Equity team at Batterymarch, where he has a track record running a market neutral hedge fund as well as global equity long only funds. Commentary

With vaccination programmes being rolled out across the developed world, economic conditions are favourable for financial assets as businesses are able to reopen and revenue streams are rejuvenated. Looking longer term, fiscal stimulus along a green agenda is likely as governments increasingly direct economic resources towards political programmes, boosting near-term economic growth but potentially reducing the prospect for longer-term private sector productivity gains. Central banks have been extremely vocal about their intention to continue to provide support to markets and financing to governments, ensuring that financial conditions will remain accommodative for the foreseeable future. Future inflation is a longer-term risk as it remains comfortably below target and central banks have unambiguously stated their reluctance to tighten policy until they have little choice but to do so.

Despite a recent sell-off in government bonds and continued strength in equity markets, equities remain the asset class with the greatest potential to compound wealth over the longer term – especially combined with careful stock selection to identify high-quality businesses at attractive valuations. An underweight position in government bonds has protected portfolios against rising yields this year. With credit spreads still tight, some high-yielding fixed income exposure has been exchanged for property, an asset whose income stream is akin to high-yielding inflation-linked fixed income and can offer protection in an inflationary environment. Some of the government bond weight remains invested in low-duration investment grade bonds, infrastructure and gold.
