

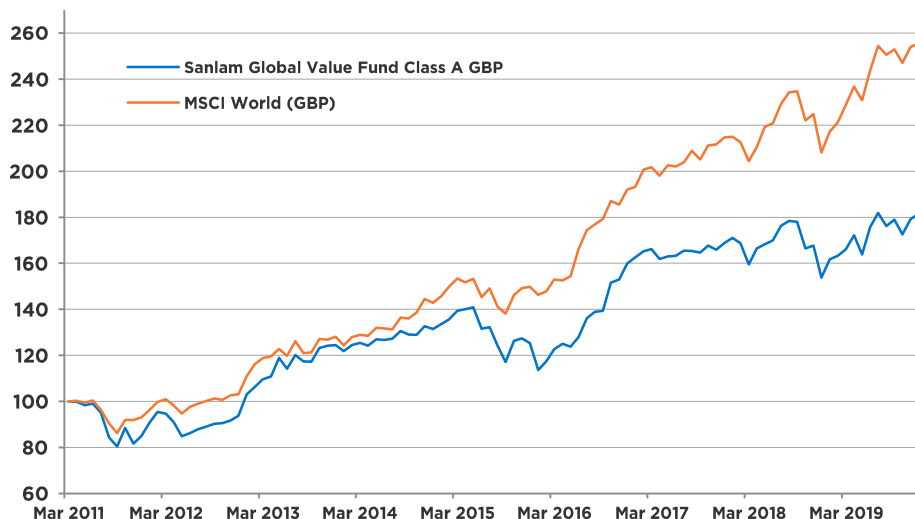
Sanlam Global Value Fund

Overview

Monthly commentary

During the month of December, the fund returned 3.7% beating the MXWO Benchmark and Value Index returns by 0.7% and 0.8% respectively. Four of the top five contributors all showed double digit returns which we were happy with.

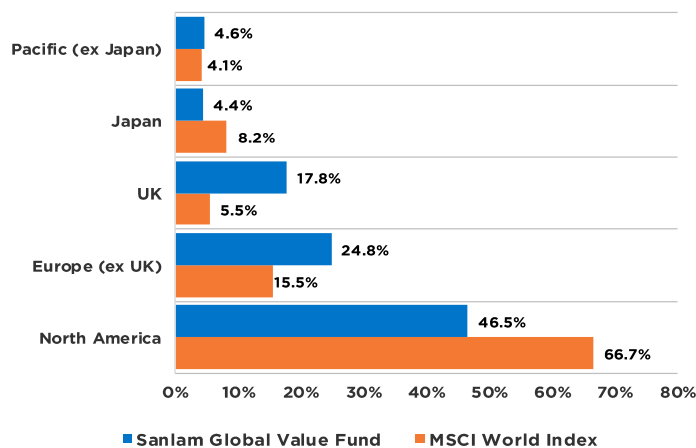
Skyworks maintained its strong run after brokers continue to upgrade their prospects for gaining market share in the 5G space while touting their exceptional free cash flow margins of 30% in a difficult year combined with the potential for Skyworks to acquire Broadcom's related business.

Corvo followed suit with a smaller rise on the same very strong prospects as 5G starts to move forward with applications far beyond simply handsets given the convergence of things and IoT in broader markets leading to TAM of anywhere between \$10bn and \$20bn. We believe very strongly in these businesses' ability to generate cash and grow over the next cycle. Corteva jumped on positive news between China and the US stating that China would be increasing its purchases of two new GM crops from Corteva (DAS-81419-2 Soybean and 55-1 Papaya) as part of their agreement to bring in more agricultural products.

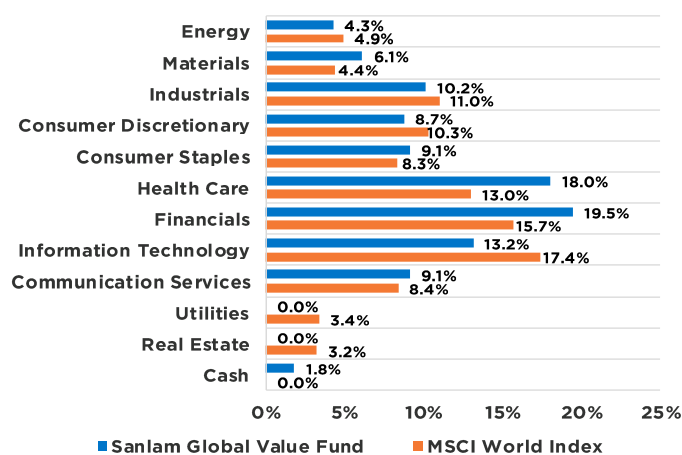
Samsung continues to perform well on the back of good results and more recently the announced push in to the EUV sphere as the tech giants increasingly design their own semiconductors to optimise everything from artificial intelligence tasks to server performance and mobile battery life, for example, Google has the Tensor processing unit, Apple has A13 Bionic and Amazon has Graviton2. All of them are unwilling to fork out on their own factories and thus Samsung is looking to capitalise on this over the next decade, putting it in competition with TSMC.

Bayer was fifth by attribution generating 8% in the month as investors took heart from the US government backing its embattled herbicide, Roundup. The US environmental protection agency sided with the company's appeal of the California ruling against Roundup and given the torrid year of defence against the purchase of Monsanto investors were pleased to cheer some good news.
